Back to life after COVID for Christ Church Community Centre (CCCC)

Fortunately, CCCC did have reserves in the bank to help us through the last year where our income has taken a huge reduction. We have been fortunate to receive two grants. One from The Knabs Ridge Wind Farm Community Fund and the other from The National Lottery Community Fund. These have helped fund some of the continuing overheads, install a ventilation system, update our refrigeration and fund some training courses. The ventilation will help to ensure that CCCC is a safe environment going forward, as fresh air will continually be brought into the main hall and small library/meeting room.

CCCC is gradually coming back to life. For those who are new to the village you may be surprised to find that a huge range of activities take place on your doorstep. The CCCC page on the village website will give you a flavour of what was available prior to this awful year we have all experienced. We envisage that not all regular groups and activities will be back until September.

The Community Library is open again on Saturday mornings from 10 am to noon, thanks to volunteers who give time to a rota. It is open to everyone, there are a good selection of books and no fines if your books are overdue!

Darley & Menwith Parish Council

The Parish Council has been holding its meetings on-line, via Zoom and has welcomed several local people to meetings. The Parish Assembly took place on 26th April, with several parishioners attending. Thanks were expressed to all those involved in the Community Covid Support Group, which has done such marvellous work over the past year. The Parish Council has agreed to install a new bench on Stocks Green, with a plaque marking the thanks of the village to all those who helped during the pandemic.

Another issue discussed was the on-going issue of dog fouling in the village, but no real solution was suggested. It is hoped that the promised visit by the HBC dog warden can soon take place once restrictions are lifted and perhaps the presence of a marked van will make a difference. Once again, the Parish Council asks all dog owners to be responsible in clearing dog dirt and disposing of bags in the bins, so that the village is kept clean and tidy and safe.

Darley's Angels WI group have proposed that Darley should consider becoming a wildflower-friendly village and have suggested that as well as encouraging individual homeowners to plant areas of wildflowers in their gardens, a small area of Stocks Green or Low Green or an alternative area be left unmown and turned over to wildflowers. This is to be discussed by Darley in Bloom, but the Parish Council would be pleased to hear any comments from people in the village, so that a decision can be made that reflects the wishes of those living here. The legislation which has allowed on-line meetings over the past year ends on 7th May and is currently not expected to be renewed, so all meetings of the Council will revert to in-person meetings from that date. Covid protocols will need to be observed, so it is has been necessary to change the venue for the monthly meetings to ensure social distancing etc. Meetings will now be held in Hookstone Memorial Hall, Low Lane and will still normally be on the last Monday of each month. The next meetings will be the Annual Meeting of the Council and an Ordinary Meeting both on 24th May from 7.30p.m., and an Ordinary Meeting on 28th June. All parishioners are welcome to attend.
