#### Think you know the WI? Think again!

SOS for HoneyBees was a campaign launched by a WI in Wiltshire in 2009. They had become concerned about the large decline in honeybees at the time and were worried that it was a major threat not only to biodiversity but to our way of life. Around a third of our diet is directly dependent on bees, making them central to our existence. The WI campaigning has ensured government funding to research into pollinator decline. Unfortunately, we are continuing to see a decline in wildlife and pollinators and the WI are still campaigning on this issue as well as other Climate and Environmental issues. Darley's Angels WI members have been following No Mow May as well as other wildlife friendly campaigns and many members have been planting wildflower areas in their garden or just allowing the "weeds" to grow. We are also working towards planting a wildflower area on Low Green with the help of Harrogate Borough Council (who are responsible for it) and other enthusiasts locally.
