Christ Church Community Centre and Christ Church join forces to solve our "Ditch " problem

CCCC and CC are so well used at certain times in the week that the car park is not big enough for all the family cars using the centres. This is creating a safety problem as cars are having to park well into the road causing a serious hazard. There is a ditch along the wall side parallel to the centre carpark therefor it is not easy to get out of cars on this side of the road without losing passengers into the ditch! This creates the problem of people parking on the opposite side of the road which is dangerous, especially on dark nights as young children are having to cross the road.

We intend to install a large drain and cover the ditch in with a Grass Guard so that cars can pull well of the road and let their passengers out safely. NYCC have given their permission to carry out this work but cannot finance the work in the foreseeable future.

We have grave concerns for the safety of children and the elderly using our premises. Rather than wait for an accident to occur CC and CCCC are going to work together to finance this project as soon as possible. If you can join for the Fish, Chip, Fun and Games Get Together, there will be a donation box to help our fund raising. In addition the funds raised by the CCCC 200 + Club this year will go towards the ditch project.

Darley & Menwith Parish Council

Parish Assembly -- 29th April

Around 30 people attended the Annual Parish Assembly and enjoyed a presentation giving updates about all the recent planning applications. The issue of traffic descending Sheepcote Lane (and Stumps Lane) too fast and without due care was raised. This has been taken up with NYCC Highways and the Parish Council will be considering what action re signage might be taken. There is also a possibility of a Vehicle Activated Sign regarding speed limit being installed somewhere in the village. These issues will be discussed at the next meeting of the Parish Council.

Affordable Housing

Thank you for completing the form regarding the above. The results were split almost 50/50, with some respondents arguing that more affordable housing is needed, particularly for older people. Others stated that there was already too much building going on in the village. A possible affordable housing development on Station Rd is currently being re-designed and reduced in size. It is not known if it will move forward to a planning application. Investigations are continuing into the possible development (by a local charity) of 2 almshouses in the village.

Update on Proposed Local Housing Developments

Current status (as at mid-May 2019) of the various major housing developments proposed within the parish: **Darley Mill (13 dwellings)** Slight variations currently with HBC Planning Dept. Work likely to start in October 2019

Land next to the White House, Main St (18 houses) Building now started and houses advertised for sale. The company advert also refers to 5 affordable houses which will be available to rent, and 2 affordable houses to be in shared ownership

Bottom of Stumps Lane (Deer Glade) House building well under away and houses available for sale Outline Planning Application for up to 60 dwellings on fields behind Meadow Lane / Low Green, with access from Meadow Lane. No recent updates

Outline Planning Application for up to 18 houses off Walker Lane. Application withdrawn.

Harrogate Borough Council Local Plan The Inspector's written comments are still awaited. It is expected that he will put forward suggested modifications to HBC and it is very likely that they will accept them as they are anxious to have the plan adopted as soon as possible

FREE FIRST AID COURSE

The Parish Council has secured the services of a Red Cross Instructor to run a session on how to deal with slips, trips and falls, as well as carrying out CPR and using an automatic defibrillator to help in cases of possible cardiac arrest. There is a village defibrillator in the bus stop in the centre of the village opposite Silverdale, and although it offers audio and written instructions, many people feel more confident if they have received some basic instruction in CPR. So – why not sign up and find out what to do?

The session is on Saturday 6th July from 10a.m. to 12 noon in Christ Church Community Centre.
