However, the Beaver and Cub Leaders managed to continue to offer a virtual programme online until we were able to resume face to face meetings. Darley Community Library

After a difficult year, the Library Service has progressively re –opened over the last few months as allowed by the easing of Covid restrictions. Whilst we have obviously had a much-restricted opportunity to loan books this year we have still had 531 visitors and loaned 575 books.

In addition to books for loan which are provided by NYCC Library services, we have introduced a new service supported by Nidd Plus which provides jigsaws to borrow.

This year we celebrate 10 years of Darley Community Library and we hope to continue for many more to come.

None of this however would be possible without the continued support of our loyal band of volunteers and

also the support provided by Christ Church Management Committee.

RAF Menwith Hill

2021-22 has continued to be affected by pandemic restrictions and changed working practices.

RAF Menwith Hill continues to observe the strictest level of Covid regulations whether they be from the UK or the US. This affected activity through the winter of 2021. Some restrictions, such as mask wearing in communal spaces, are still present in early 2022. Our Base Director, Mr Chris D. Agar, has spent his first full year with us and is hoping 2022 will provide the opportunity for events and outreach not possible during his tenure to this point.

We were able to hold a socially distanced Civic Leaders Briefing morning in September 2021. This was attended by over 15 Mayors and Parish Council Chairman from the local area.

We continued our outreach work spending two days with Darley School and 8 in Ripon Walled Garden. We spent two days in Pateley Bridge in March 2022 and will continue working there in the autumn, as well as returning to Darley School. We are also volunteering alongside the Darley Playing Fields Association. The base Toy Drive took place in December 2021 collecting over £16,000 of gift cards, vouchers and toys for children and young people in need in the local area.

The base rationalization programme, begun after the major manpower re-shuffle in 2015, is nearing its end. All that remains to be demolished are the 1980s houses at the north eastern corner of the base, and the old police HQ. The water tower, not part of the demolition programme, is also due to be dismantled. Other than what has been previously reported, there have been no new additions to infrastructure. Press coverage about expansion of the base is misleading and caused by confused local journalism which reported a 45-foot long portacabin as a 45-metre-high building.

However, re-design of the main gate will commence this year which may cause some inconvenience both on Menwith Hill Road and on the B6451 by the Nessfield entrance.

Darley Memorial Hall

The Hall has reopened after the Pandemic, with Dances, Film Nights restarting, as well as Snooker and Bowls.

Gym Club continue to use the Hall four times a week. The Hall has been used for a charity Race Night, a couple of Weddings and Birthday Parties.

Darley Memorial Hall Look forward to welcoming the community back to the Hall.

Christ Church Community Centre (CCCC)

2021 was a difficult year for CCCC. The committee with support from members of our local community have managed to meet the challenge to keep CCCC available for use when government guidelines allowed.

As the summer approached more groups were allowed to return. Many of our users are elderly and were understandably anxious not to return to group activities,

consequently life did not return to CCCC fully until September. Our income was significantly impacted with the result that CCCC had to draw £500 from reserves to meet overhead expenses.

Book Exchange and Butties, Bakes and Brews are regular coffee mornings that encourage people to meet and chat.

Lunch club has evolved into Meet and Eat, a community drop- in lunch which we hope will encourage more villagers to call in and enjoy a hot meal and company.

Progress with the improvements to the west entrance has been slow, next year we hope to complete the work.

Funding from Knabs Ridge Wind farm Community Fund and the National Lottery Community Support Fund have facilitated the installation of a ventilation system and extra freezer capacity.

A defibrillator has been installed thanks to generous support from the Darley with Menwith Parish Council, Harrogate Borough Councillor Thomas Watson, and North Yorkshire County Councillor Stanley Lumley.

We face a doubling of our energy costs next year which will necessitate increasing our hire fees.

Dedicated volunteers who organise a vast range of groups are the life blood of CCCC, their role is essential to the success and future of this community centre, their contribution in 2021 is much appreciated and will continue to be vital going forward into 2022.

Hookstone Memorial Hall

It is good to see the hall's use growing following a couple of years of restrictions due to Covid 19. There have been a couple of events on a Saturday morning which have been well supported. Bookings for private events are also increasing.

Darley Playing Fields Association

The past 12 months have been busy for the DPFA. The gradual loosening of the COVID-19 restrictions allowed us to hold a firework display in November albeit with restricted numbers and it felt great to be able to host the community once again as well as raise some much-needed funds.

The football field has been well-used and thanks to the recent drainage improvements has proved to be an excellent playing surface throughout the winter.

The children's playground entry/exit restrictions have now been removed and some of the adult equipment repaired and back in use. Regular inspections continue and work was carried out to repaint some playground equipment with great support from volunteers from RAF Menwith Hill.

Steve Willis and his team at the shop have continued to provide an excellent service to Darley villagers over the last year and we continue the Meals on Wheels service with help from many local volunteers.

The DPFA Trustees are always looking to improve and expand the facilities on offer and after identifying we had available space, proposed the building of a Boules Court. Work was started at the end of March and the two-lane court is now finished and ready to be used. Once again we received enormous support from RAF Menwith Hill and the Men's Shed in Pateley Bridge. Financial support came from the National Lottery Communities fund and the Parish Council donated two Platinum Jubilee benches.

Looking forward we would like to further develop the children's playground with more equipment and we will be consulting with the community shortly.

Christ Church

Last year was another unusual one, dominated by Covid and discussion about what we are allowed to do, wanted to do, and whether people would attend if we did things a particular way. Services gradually returned to their normal pattern as the virus seemed to be less harmful and so many of the congregation and the community were vaccinated. Throughout it all Alastair, our Vicar, was there offering his leadership, support, thoughtful guidance and shear hard work providing normal services and online version as the times dictated, in spite of succumbing to Covid himself.

Other than the streaming of services, this has not been a time for innovation or major changes. We have reviewed our safety policies, considered our responsibilities for the environment and begun to plan fund raising again, as our reserves have been depleted. Thankfully the community use of the church is now picking up This has enabled us to build up the reserves in the past, but with increasing energy costs will not be quite so easy now.

Focus on Darley

This organisation is made up of all the local groups and publishes the regular Newsletter which keeps everyone in the village informed about activities and events and organises community events on behalf of the village. A

Food Safety course for all those involved in food preparation at events is also being arranged.

New Year's Eve celebrations were arranged for December 2021 but unfortunately the Omicron variant of Covid 19 meant that they had to be cancelled at short notice. However, it was agreed to hold a Platinum Jubilee Celebration Ball on 28th May 2022 for which Alison Jane's Chequers Band have agreed to perform.
